SUMMARY OF THE VESTRY MEETING OF APRIL 18

- Chris Hart called the meeting to order at 6:00.
- Chris Hart led us in devotional time, centered around the spiritual aspects of the recent solar eclipse.
- The minutes of the March 21 meeting were approved as amended.
- Gwen Mousin, Treasurer reported on the finances, which are proceeding according to the budget. The accounting process is being refined, and procedures for streamlining reports are continuing apace. The result will be easier understanding of the budget and spending, as well as improved reporting of our finances to the Diocese.
- Mary Lindquist presented the Rector's Report:
 - o Mary expressed her appreciation for all who participated in Holy Week services.
 - She will be away on vacation from April 22 to May 6.
 - Plans are being made for a Newcomers event in June.
 - A policy will be prepared for accepting donations on behalf of other organizations that have asked us for fiscal sponsorships.
- Senior Warden's Report
 - The Listening Corner is being improved. The "corner" was moved closer to where parishioners actually gather.
- What's on their minds? Choir audio fidelity in the video streams will be improved in the near future with a new camera and microphone. An email address and link will be added to the stream to make it easier to ask questions of the clergy and staff.
 - Jeff Lewis' book discussion group on aging is continuing their discussion of a second book. Another book will follow. (This is a reminder than it's easy to start a discussion group around books relevant to the St. Michael's community!)

• Junior Warden's Report

- Skyberry House will have a movie night on May 9 in the Undercroft featuring a movie about Dorthy Day. On May 12, the Adult Forum will be led by Elizabeth Moriarty, who grew up in a hospitality house.
- The Tag Sale is fast approaching! Preparations are being made apace.

• Committee Reports

- Paul circulated an update about the ministry, including profiles of new families we're sponsoring. A benefit concert is coming up. Rental and transportation remain high priorities.
- Hospitality Committee had a successful orientation of new coffee hour hosts.
- Closing Prayer was offered by Margery McCrum
- The meeting adjourned at 8:05 pm



SUMMARY OF THE VESTRY MEETING OF MAY 16

- John Lent joined us and opened the meeting leading us in a time of reflection and discussion about Christian Stewardship. John will be taking on more of a leadership role on the Stewardship Committee this year, seeking to take some of the load from Mary's shoulders.
- adwoa joined us to give an update on her work, both in her role as assistant priest here at St. Michael's and how her work at the diocesan level is evolving with the ministry funded by the Lilly Grant which she and Jeanie worked so hard to secure last year. We also heard about the life of the Wednesday morning group which meets at The Works, adwoa's evolving role as a visible clergy person serving at Loaves & Fishes, and her liturgical work in which she is acting as celebrant more often. She talked about her Diocesan work with the Green Mountain Online Abbey and about how the initiative she's developing with the Lilly funding will be working to provide pastoral support, resources, connection and more to lay leaders who are taking on important work in smaller congregations around the diocese.
- The Minutes of the April 18 Vestry meeting were approved.
- Gwen Mousin joined us via Zoom to present the Treasurer's Report.
- Christine Hart, our **Senior Warden**, gave an update on the **Finance Taskforce**'s work and reported that our **bookkeeping team** going forward will be Deb Bunker and Casey Parris. Vestry members voiced appreciation for the work reformatting financial reports to make them more accessible for incoming Vestry members in particular.
- In the **Rector's Repor**t, Mary updated us on some **upcoming events** on the Rectory lawn after upcoming 10:15 services a Newcomers Lunch on June 2 and Sundae Sunday on June 9 to celebrate end of the school year.

Mary also brought up the need for some protocol for difficult situations that may arise at church. There was some discussion of the value of **creating policy/guidance** in general. This led into some followup on questions previously raised about the church acting as a fiscal sponsor.

- Junior Warden, Susan Heimer gave updates on
 - **Skyberry House** group, including a visit to a House of Hospitality in Worcester MA and the successful movie night and Sunday morning Forum.
 - Plans for a **Summer Program** for youth during the first half of our 10:15 services with activities for combined age groups. Looking for a few more adult volunteers to help supervise/lead activities.
- Margery McCrum gave ministry liaison reports
 - The **Pastoral Care** team continues to meet, usually on Zoom, led by Mary and Lars. The team currently has 7 active church members and would welcome some new members. The team keeps in contact with members of the congregation who are homebound or in nursing homes and who may be in need of additional support. Discussion of parishioners' needs in meetings are kept in confidence, so names will not be added to prayers of the people by the team, but only by direct request or permission of the person in question.

- The Choir continues to grow into its work under Director of Music Keane Southard. We heard about the meeting of the choir Mary organized in March to take time to reflect on the time of transition and to discuss Keane and the choir's shared vision for our music ministry and how to work together to achieve those goals.
- Paul Gallagher reported that proceeds from the River Singers recent concerts had been donated to support the work of the Refugee Ministry. Some River Singers members, including the director, have become connected to the ministry's work as volunteers.
- Thank yous were addressed to Tag Sale organizers and to Tom and Lars for subbing for Mary while she was away recently.
- Cary Gaunt closed the meeting with prayer
