





## The Great Thanksgiving


The people remain standing. The Celebrant faces them and sings

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,


## The Lord's Prayer

And the blessing of God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, be upon you and remain with you for ever. **Amen**.



#### SWORDS TO PLOWSHARES EVENT, MAY 4

Swords to Plowshares will hold a special public educational and demonstration event on Sunday May 4, 2025, from 12-3 PM, on the grounds of Saint Michael's Episcopal Church. Swords to Plowshares, Vermont is a Windham County-based nonprofit organization dedicated to gun safety and gun violence education. Working closely with the Windham County Sheriff's Office and the Brattleboro Police Department, Swords to Plowshares, Vermont offers a way for individuals to safely dispose of unwanted firearms which are then transformed into garden tools, jewelry, and artwork by blacksmith artists, among them students from the Putney School. The May 4 event will feature a live demonstration of the process for transforming unwanted firearms into garden tools. Attendees will also have a chance to take part in the transformational process themselves, wielding a blacksmith's hammer. Free gun safety locks, courtesy of the Windham County Sheriff's Department, will also be available, along with literature about safe gun storage.

Tom Ely, Ann Ely, and Cliff Wood from Saint Michael's all serve on the Swords to Plowshares, Vermont Board, and welcome you to this free public event. Rain or Shine!

**YOUTH CHOIR UPDATE:** You may recall that back in the fall we launched the **Beloved Community Youth Choir**, which is a new incarnation of the St. Michael's Choir School but with a slightly different focus. The choir aims to develop both social and musical skills in youth by using music to instill the practices of Martin Luther King Jr.'s philosophy of nonviolence. Activities include listening to and singing a diverse repertoire of music with a focus on social justice.

Starting next month, we are relaunching the choir with a 6-week session and hoping to build a core group of consistent participants to help this choir grow and continue into the future. Rehearsals will

be in the choir room on Tuesdays 3:45-4:45pm (with arrival/snack starting at 3:30pm) starting May 20 and ending late June for summer break (then planning to restart when school starts again in the fall). It's open for free to all children in grades 2-6 in the Brattleboro area, so please share the word with any friends who have children in these grades--no affiliation with St. Michael's required!
